Berlin

Experience the vibrancy of Germany's capital and visit the historic sites: the Berlin Wall, Brandenburg Gate and Checkpoint Charlie.

Dresden

The abundance and splendor of Dresden's cultural treasures will take your breath away. Visit the historic places that Dresden is famous for: the Semper Opera, the Zwinger and the Church of our Lady. Stroll along the enchanting Elbe River and enjoy the stunning river landscape that is the setting for this most beautiful city.

Nuernberg

While this city is one of the most significant historic cities in Germany with its medieval fortifications, it is also a city of scholars, skilled craftspeople and artisans.



Munich

Enjoy the historic inner city with one of the finest squares in Europe, the Marienplatz, its world class galleries and visits to the BMW museum and famous beer hall, the Hofbraeuhaus. A highlight of your Germany Tour will be the guided walking tour of the historic sites of Munich.



Rothenburg ob der Tauber

Strolling through the quaint and narrow little streets of Rothenburg will make you feel that you have been transported back in time into the medieval era.

Castle Neuschwanstein and Oberammergau

See mad King Ludwig's fairy-tale castle Neuschwanstein and admire the beautifully painted houses in Oberammergau.

Garmisch-Partenkirchen (Bavarian Alps)

This small township has one of the most charming landscapes in the Bavarian Alps and is at the foot of Germany's highest mountain, the glacier-covered Zugspitze. Enjoy the breathtaking views from the summit, gentle strolls through alpine meadows overlooking deep blue lakes, or more challenging hikes in the mountains along crystal clear streams and waterfalls.



Strasbourg (France)

Visit one of the most delightful cities in Europe, just across the border from Germany and admire the city's beautiful architecture from the comfort of a canal boat.



Heidelberg

Enjoy a stroll along banks of the Neckar River, through this 12th Century small town with its quaint alleyways, plazas and world famous castle.

Koblenz (Rhine River)

Experience the Rhine River on a leisurely cruise and cross it by cable car. 2000 year old Koblenz has much to offer and another highlight of your Germany tour will be the visit to castle Ehrenbreitstein.

Lindau (Lake Constance)

Take a leisurely cruise on Lake Constance, Europe's third largest lake, which is bordered by 3 countries: Germany, Austria and Switzerland. Walk along the lake foreshore in Bregenz and explore the quaint island town of Lindau with its picturesque harbour.



Gutach (Black Forest)

Stay in a historic farm house in the center of the Black Forest, traverse the forest in one of the most scenic train rides in Europe and taste the best Black Forest cakes and other locally produced specialties.



This independent tour of Germany can start at any time, can be shortened, extended or combined with any of our other tours to create a unique itinerary.

Inclusions in italics

Day 1 & 2 - Berlin

Get to know Berlin's famous sites by bus or on a guided walking or bike tour or from the comfort of a canal boat. See the city's main attractions: the Berlin Wall, Brandenburg Gate, the parliament building and lesser-known hidden gems.

Day 3 - Berlin

During your *excursion* to nearby UNESCO world heritage listed Potsdam visit the imperial palace Sanssouci and Babelberg Palace nestled in a stunning landscape park.



Potsdam, once home to Prussian royalty, frequently flies under the radar of visiting international tourists. Apart from it stately homes, gardens, parks and elegant palaces it has a Dutch Quarter, comprised of 134 Dutch–style redbrick homes, a Russian Quarter, Roman Baths and a historical windmill.

Day 4 - Dresden

Explore the splendour of Dresden by bus at your own pace and take time to *visit this city's famous landmarks*: Germany's most famous opera house the Semper Opera house, the Zwinger with its baroque complex of pavilions and galleries and the cathedral (Frauenkirche), the majestic dome of which dominates the cityscape.

Day 5 - Dresden

Take a *guided walking tour* and discover Dresden's fascinating history and architecture, see one of the world's longest murals in the Royal Mews courtyard and admire the collections in the stunning Royal Palace, which dates back to the 14th Century. If you are on a family vacation and travelling with children you could choose to discover Dresden with a thrilling *scavenger hunt* instead.

Day 6 - Nuernberg

Spend the afternoon of your arrival day to explore the historic inner city with its lovely half-timbered houses, medieval fortifications, cobble-stoned streets and alleyways.



Day 7 - Nuernberg

During a guided 4-hour walking tour you will understand the important historic role that Nuernberg has played as the centre of the Roman Empire to the more recent days of Hitler's Third Reich.

Your guide will take you from the bustling central square around the medieval city walls to the castle's imperial courtyards. You will visit Nuernberg's Nazi Party rally grounds and hear about the famous Nuernberg trials while visiting the documentation center.

Day 8 - Munich

Take the afternoon and see Van Gogh's famous paintings in the New Pinakothek gallery, visit the BMW museum or the Dachau concentration camp on the outskirts of Munich.



As Munich is the beer capital of the world you might like to kick off your visit to this city by sampling some of their finely crafted beers at the world famous Hofbraeuhaus, together with some hearty Bavarian fare while listening to an oompah band.

Day 9 - Munich

Your day starts with a *guided walking tour* that takes you to the places of Munich's dark past, where the Third Reich had its origins, where Adolf Hitler's voice could first be heard and which was the stage for some of the Nazi's worst crimes. Or you can choose *a city tour and visit to the Allianz arena*, home to soccer club Bayern Munich, one of the world's most spectacular stadiums.

Day 10 - Excursion to medieval Rothenburg from Munich

On your *full day guided coach excursion* to Rothenburg you can immerse yourself in castles and medieval villages as you travel along the Romantic Road to Rothenburg.

Harburg, one of the oldest and best preserved castles in southern Germany, which was a strategically important stronghold in the 11th Century, will be your first stop.

In Rothenburg, the most perfectly preserved medieval town in Europe, you will have 3 hours to stroll around the quaint inner town and to visit the impressive St Jacob's Church, a light-filled gothic building with soaring ceilings.

Day 11 & 12 - Garmisch-Partenkirchen (Bavarian Alps)

Stroll along streets and alleyways, across little bridges and past beautifully painted houses, their balconies adorned with masses of flowers, and you will understand why the people who live in this charmed corner of the world are envied. The historic sites, breathtaking panorama of the Bavarian Alps, dramatic gorges, flowering alpine meadows and a country town steeped in tradition will make you feel that you have arrived in a little paradise on earth.



Take the charming cogwheel train to the top of the Zugspitze glacier-covered mountain. At the 9000 feet summit you have breathtaking views of more than 400 peaks in Austria, Italy, Switzerland and Germany.

And for a thrill of a lifetime *take the Alpenspitz cable car to* the summit, where you will find two steel platforms cantilevered over the abyss, at the end of which you will be standing 1,000 meters above the 'Hell valley'.



Day 13 - Excursion to Castle Neuschwanstein and Oberammergau

Your all-day private excursion will take you first of all to the iconic Neuschwanstein Castle, the most visited in castle in Germany. And it is not just the castle itself, but the location of the castle on a hill in a magnificent landscape overlooking the Hohenschwangau valley, that will make you feel you have arrived in the middle of a fairy-tale.

You then travel on to Oberammergau, which is not just world-famous for its woodcarvers, richly painted houses and Passion Play, but also for their traditional craftsmenship. Watch the craftsmen and women in their studios in the Pilate house demonstrating traditional handcraft skills in woodcarving, pottery, drum making and stained glass making, crafts that have been used for hundreds of years.

Day 14 & 15 - Lindau (Lake Constance)

Explore the historic town of Lindau, which is actually an island in Lake Constance, full of medieval and half-timbered buildings and an absolute charming place. *Take a boat tour* from the small harbour and just sit back and enjoy *coffee and cake* while admiring the view of the Austrian and Swiss Alps across the lake.

Take the ferry to nearby Bregenz in Austria (movie location for the James Bond movie 'Quantum of Solace') for a lovely walk along the lake shore. Then hop on the cable car up to the Pfänder Mountain from where you have the most magnificent views across the lake and the mountains. High above the lake is Bregenz' old town, Oberstadt. This tiny town with its winding streets, colourful houses and gardens is enclosed by defensive walls and is just asking to be explored.

Day 16 & 17 - Gutach (Black Forest)



Your visit to the Vogtsbauernhof open air museum will make the culture and history of this region come alive. Six restored and equipped farmhouses, dating back to the late 16th Century, will provide you with an inside how people have lived and worked in the Black Forest over the last 400 year. Add to this display visits to the adjoining buildings: a water mill, store houses, distillery, bakery, chapel, saw mill, hemp press, oil mill and forge and you can look forward to spending several enchanting and interesting hours walking from one building to the next.



Take a scenic ride on the Black Forest Panorama train, one of the oldest mountain lines in the world, passing directly across the Black Forrest, viaducts, tunnels and through spectacular scenery. En-route visit the town of Triberg and see Germany's highest waterfall in a wild and romantic landscape, the baroque pilgrimage church and cuckoo clocks shops and workshops. And last not least sample a slice or two of the finest Black Forest Cake.

Day 18 - Excursion to Strasbourg (France)

Take the Black Forest train and this time head west towards Strasbourg, one of Europe's most attractive cities. The entire town centre has been listed as a UNESCO

world heritage site with its cathedral of Notre Dame and the 'Petite France Quarter', Strasbourg's most picturesque district, which onetime was home to fishermen, millers and tanners.

Take a cruise through the waterways of France's 'little Venice' and see the magnificent 13th Century towers, roofed wooden footbridges and half-timbered houses built level with the waterways.

Visit or perhaps even have lunch in the restaurant of the Kammerzell house , the architectural 'jewel in the crown' of this town, where since the 15th Century merchants have been selling their goods under the ornately carved stone arches.

Day 19 - Heidelberg

This 12th Century small city with its world famous castle, picturesque setting and Mediterranean climate has been the center of Germany's 'Romantic Movement' and inspiration to numerous literary figures, not to mention Elvis Presley.

The cog-wheel train will take you right from the center of town to the fortress where you can enjoy the splendid view across the Neckar valley. Take some time to stroll around the terraces, gardens and fortifications of this iconic 14th Century castle.

Take a walk on the 'Philosopher's path', across the Neckar River from the castle and enjoy the beautiful gardens, mansions and views of the old city and the castle.



Day 20 & 21 - Koblenz (Rhine and Mosel River)

Explore Koblenz, one of the most beautiful and oldest cities in Germany with over 2000 years of history, where the Rhine and Mosel Rivers flow together.



Take the cable car for a spectacular ride across the Rhine River and arrive at fortress Ehrenbreitstein, whose origins go back to the 1st century and is Germany's second largest preserved fortress.

Enjoy a leisurely cruise on the Rhine or Moselle, floating past medieval castles and hill-top fortification, vineyards and villages. This section of the Rhine provides one of the most magnificent cultural landscapes in Europe. The richness and beauty of this middle Rhine region has been recognized with a UNESCO world heritage listing.

The various sightseeing tours at your destinations will be pre-booked and we will provide you with detailed information regarding the time and content of the tour, and departure points.

Communication

Travelling in Europe, in particular Western Europe, you will find that you won't have any communication problems as good English is widely spoken. Sharing of local knowledge and insights into the culture and history of the country you are visiting, usually provided by a tour leader, will be available during your sightseeing tours by local expert guides.
